State Representative Jim Cobb

Senator Mike Bell of Riceville and Representative Cobb introduced legislation to honor Volunteer Fire Departments. Representative Cobb read the bill and presented a framed copy to Fire Chief Mike Miles; he also stated TN was able to balance the budget without raising taxes and adjourned their session early this year saving tax payers over half a million dollars.

Communications from Mayor and Commissioners

Commissioner Kaylor informed the board the Alhambra Shrine presented the city with an appreciation award for allowing them to set up and raise funds the past 5 years.

Approval of June 9 2011 minutes

A motion to accept the July 14 and August 1, 2011 minutes was made by Vice Mayor Massengill; 2nd by Commissioner Beene. Motion carried 6 – 1; Commissioner Kaylor abstained.

Consent Agenda

A motion to accept the consent agenda as presented was made by Commissioner Kaylor; 2nd by Commissioner Clements. Motion carried 7 – 0.

Old Business

The board would like MTAS to draft a sample ordinance for them to review. Vice Mayor Massengill wants the board to be mindful of traffic surrounding the churches when deciding when and where the sale of fireworks would be allowed.

New Business

Planning Assistance Contract

The cost for the South East TN Development District to offer this service is the same we were paying with the Planning Office. Commissioner Kaylor feels we'll have more one on one than in the past; due to the structure they explained during last month's meeting. A motion to approve the Planning Assistance Contract with South East TN Development District was made by Commissioner Beene; 2nd by Commissioner Kaylor. Motion carried 7 - 0.

Electrical Work at the park

We received 2 bids on the electrical work at the park 1 from Messimer Electric and the other from Morgan Electric. After reviewing the bids a motion was made to have Messimer Electric complete the work for \$1965.00 by Commissioner Kaylor, 2nd by Commissioner Davenport. Motion carried 7 - 0.

Bass, Berry, Sims Issuance of \$376,000 Water Revenue Bond

This bond is for the Water Treatment Plant; a motion was made to approve the issuance of \$376,000 water revenue bond by Mayor Doss; 2nd by Commissioner Massengill. Motion carried 7 - 0.

Paving of Old Graysville Road

Road Superintendent Tommy Snyder has a contract with Rodgers Group for paving roads within the county. Municipals are taking advantage of the contract the City of Dayton is paving Old Graysville Road to Dayco Drive and the county will continue the paving to the City Limits of Graysville. Superintendent Snyder asked if Graysville would be willing to cover the cost of the .08 mile stretch from the City Limits to Hickman Crossing; the cost will be between \$40,000 - \$45,000. This includes widening the road and stripping it. Superintendent Snyder said the city could pay him in June 2013 when the current loan for the paving of the streets is paid for so it will not put a financial burden on the city; he will have a contract drawn up for the city to sign. A motion for Road Superintendent Tommy Snyder to have a contract drawn up outlining the details of the paving of Old Graysville Road and the payment options was made by Commissioner Kaylor; 2nd by Commissioner Beene. Motion carried 7 - 0. The paving

is schedule to start in 2 weeks once the contract is drawn up City Recorder Horton will forward to everyone for review if everyone approves Mayor Doss will sign contract.

Any properly presented new business

No new business submitted.

Citizen Input

Mr. Tommy Swafford has lived in Graysville 40 years and has never seen the water rates go up why are they going up now? Mayor Doss explained we have operated at a loss the past 2 years and the State will not allow this for a third year. We must take steps to operate with a profit or the State can take over the water system.

Mr. Swafford is also upset due to police officers never patrolling his street; and seeing the patrol cars in Dayton at different times and seeing a patrol car in Soddy Daisy at 2:30 am. Mayor Doss explained the officers have court in Dayton and make bank runs. Mr. Swafford said the Police Chief has the board buffaloed.

Mr. Swafford questioned comp time for salary employees, he has worked salary jobs before and was never given comp time if a job takes 10 hours a day and you are salary you put in 10 hours a day and know you don't get anything additional because it's your job. Mayor Doss said City Recorder Michelle Horton over see's the comp time; this was talked about a year and a half ago and the board does not fell anyone is misusing the comp time.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Kaylor; 2nd by Commissioner Beene. Motion carried 7 – 0.
