G. R. Rush & Company Audit Report

Mr. David DiStefano with G. R. Rush & Company's Auditor thanked the board for allowing them to process the 2010/2011 city audit. Mr. DiStefano reviewed a few pages of the audit should there be any questions from mayor and commissioners. Mr. DiStefano said he was pleased with the cooperation City Recorder Michelle Horton and Municipal Clerk Amanda Sulcer offered during the audit.

Communications from Mayor and Commissioners

Commissioner Kaylor invited everyone to attend the Senior Breakfast on April 14, 2012.

Commissioners Beene and Miller join the meeting.

Approval of March 8, 2012 minutes

A motion to accept the March 8, 2012 minutes was made by Vice Mayor Massengill; 2nd by Commissioner Beene. Commissioner Kaylor Abstained Motion carried 6-1.

Consent Agenda for March

A motion to accept the Consent Agenda for March was made by Commissioner Redden; 2nd by Vice Mayor Massengill. Motion carried 7-0.

Old Business

Zoning Ordinance 2012-3 – Second Reading

A motion to accept Zoning Ordinance 2012-3 was made by Commissioner Kaylor; 2nd by Commissioner Davenport. Motion carried 7-0.

Updating Section 7 Chapter 5 Fire Protection and Fire Works

Vice Mayor Massengill ask, "What brought this up to make a change, what are the concerns?" Mayor Doss gave one example vendors selling on highway to people who set them off in city, so why not allow the sale of them inside city limits.

The commission had much discussion concerning the safety of fireworks, concerns being: No shooting on premise, not selling to children under 10, selling around fuel stations, is permit required and what is the cost of permit. City Recorder Michelle Horton is to draw up an ordinance and present at next month's meeting.

Properly Presented Old Business

Commissioner Kaylor was absent from last month's meeting regarding the photo enforcement camera, he feels there should be signs at all entrances to city saying camera photo enforcement. Officer Rick Anderson said signs have been ordered for each entrance to city.

New Business

Emergency Generator

Emergency Generator for new water treatment plant will cost around \$30,000.00 for a 90 kilowatt. A motion to purchase the 90 kilowatt generator as long as money is there was made by Vice Mayor Massengill; 2nd by Commissioner Kaylor. Motion carried 7-0.

Local Government Proposal

Commissioner Kaylor made motion to accept the proposal for computer and printers from local government; 2nd by Commissioner Redden. Motion carried 7-0

Cemetery CD

Mayor Doss suggests using the \$4,003.80 towards a new lawn mower to help with upkeep of cemetery. Commissioner Kaylor made motion to bid out for a new lawnmower, compatible to the one we currently have; 2nd by Commissioner Davenport. Discussion Vice Mayor Massengill is concerned about the amount of money over the \$4003.80. Mayor Doss said each department which benefits from the mower could help with the cost. Vice

Mayor Massengill doesn't want to burden the other departments when money is already tight. City Recorder Horton said instead of burdening the other departments the remaining cost could come from the fund balance. Motion carried 7-0

Private Chapter No 36 House Bill No 2500

Mayor Doss made a motion to pass House Bill 2500. Due to lack of 2nd Motion Fails

Any properly presented new business

Vice Mayor Massengill ask about fire department security cameras. He said Public Works Director Gary Doss is supposed to put them up. City Recorder Horton said they have been for 2 weeks.

Commissioner Redden had a citizen ask about animal control working at annex instead of patrolling roads for dogs. She would like to know if he is getting paid from animal control funds or is he volunteering his time. City Recorder Horton said he is getting paid thru the animal control fund; but when an animal call comes in he leaves the annex to handle the call. Commissioner Reddens only problem with it is he isn't catching dogs while working at annex.

Vice Mayor Massengill ask; is animal control officer still getting only the 25 hours allotted to him? City Recorder Horton said the weeks he is over at annex he may get 6 hours more. Vice Mayor Massengill feels his pay for time at annex should come from another department instead of animal control funds with Commissioner Redden agreeing with him.

Citizen Input

Mr. Mike Knox "I thought you said there would be a sign at the camera, like in Chattanooga if they could get by with only putting sign at city limits that's what they would have done but they got it posted everywhere they have camera saying photo enforced".

"With cop being with the camera all the time; does that mean the camera is hooked to car in any way?" Commissioner Redden replied No.

"If cops not there with camera what happens? For example if cop leaves to go to bathroom does he deactivate camera?" Commissioner Redden said if they detect something on disk and know the cop was absent at that time the violator will not get ticket.

“How many water meters we got? How many is inside and how many outside?” Municipal Clerk Sulcer said city averages 723 bills being mailed each month. City Recorder Horton said 123 is outside meters.

“What do we pay for garbage each month?” City Recorder Horton said \$8.00. Mike; that’s a lot of money being made we should be sporting a new garbage truck by now. Mayor Doss said a lot of cities are going to No Slinger garbage trucks, due to workers compensation and law suits.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mayor Doss;
2nd by Commissioner Kaylor Motion carried 7 – 0.
